I am pleased to submit the 2025 Senate Graduate Studies Committee Annual Report.

The Senate Graduate Studies Committee is charged by Senate with the following terms of reference:

1. *To maintain the academic standards established by Senate.*
2. *To review and make recommendations to Senate concerning new graduate programs.*
3. *To review and make recommendations to Senate concerning major changes to graduate programs.*
4. *To review and approve all proposed new graduate courses, course deletions, and minor changes to programs. These changes shall be reported to Senate in summary form.*
5. *To administer, review and make recommendations to Senate concerning Graduate General Regulations.*
6. *To consider matters concerning Faculty of Graduate Studies referred to the Committee, and to make recommendations to the appropriate bodies.*
7. *To consider and decide on policy recommendations concerning graduate course registration, course and program withdrawal procedures, and on the administration of graduate records.*

This report covers the period of January 1, 2025 to December 31, 2025, during which SGSC held 11 meetings and one SGSC Retreat.

SGSC Appeal subcommittee (Unsatisfactory Progress under GGR 1.8.2)

There were four completed appeals in 2025. One additional appeal was received and will be considered by an SGSC Appeal Subcommittee in 2026.

SGSC Individualized Interdisciplinary Studies Steering Committee

In 2025, three applications were reviewed, three students were offered admission and three accepted. A total of eight INS students graduated in 2025, and as of the end of 2025, there are 30 active INS students.

Discussions on Graduate Education

The SGSC discussed a range of important matters, including Provincial Attestation Letters (PALs), BASS funding and the requirement for Indigenous consultation in new program proposals. The committee also reviewed guidelines for students and instructional staff in the event of a labour dispute, updates to the funding portal, Graduate Progress Report (GPR) as well as laddered pathways. Additional discussions focused on minimum funding implementation and future plans, admissions challenges, learning and teaching AI guidelines and the development of an AI transparency template. Other topics included Tri-Council Awards, part time students in thesis-based programs, stigma among students with accessibility needs, graduate supervisor policies, and the delineation of Master's programs.

SGSC reviewed, recommended, approved, and submitted to Senate curriculum changes related to the addition, deletion, and modification of programs and courses.

In 2024/25, the overall number of applications dropped sharply by 19.9% compared to the previous academic year, falling from 10,513 to 8,419. This decline was driven primarily by a 28% decrease in international applicants (from 7,618 to 5,484), while domestic applications saw a modest 1.4% increase (from 2,895 to 2,935). The overall number of applications is approximately 4% below the three-year average.

From 2023/24 to 2024/25, the number of offers extended increased by 7.1%, rising from 2,907 to 3,113. International offers grew slightly by 2.7% (from 1,473 to 1,513), while domestic offers increased by 11.6% (from 1,434 to 1,600). The number of accepted offers rose marginally by 2.5%, from 2,179 to 2,234, with domestic acceptances increasing by 9.3% and international acceptances declining by 6.1%.

New enrollments rebounded slightly, increasing by 4.6% to 1,785, compared to 1,707 in the previous year. Domestic enrollments grew by 11.5%, while international enrollments continued to decline, dropping by 7.4%.

Total graduate enrollment headcount decreased by 2.2%, from 4,041 to 3,951, continuing the downward trend in 2024/25. Master's and Doctoral degree students also declined by 0.9%, from 3,679 to 3,644.

There was a 10.4% decrease in the total number of credentials awarded (including certificates and diplomas), falling from 1,681 in 2024 to 1,506 in 2025. Master's degrees awarded dropped by 12.7%, from 1,302 to 1,136, reversing the previous year's growth. Doctoral degrees, however, saw an increase of 12.4%, rising from 170 to 191.
