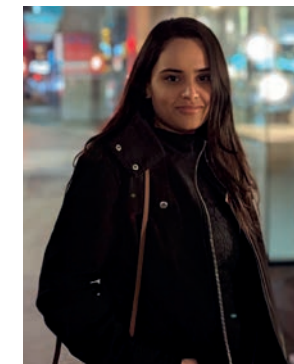

If I could go back, I’d tell her it all works out. The effort was always worth it.”

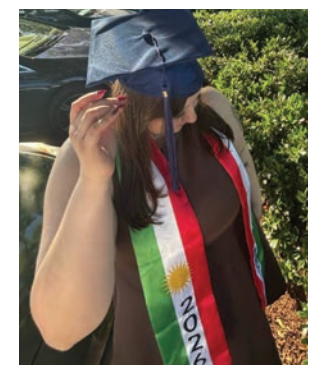

FASS One

FASS One is a first-year experience admission option offered at SFU’s Surrey campus specifically designed to connect first-year students with peers as well as professors.

Benefits of the FASS One program include reserved seating in core major courses, priority course enrolment in all other FASS Surrey courses, small class sizes, weekly mentoring sessions, a dedicated academic advisor and a friendly team of peer mentors to support your transition from high school to university.



Student unions

Meet fellow students with similar academic interests and career goals. As a FASS student, you automatically belong to the Society for Arts and Social Sciences (SASS), as well as departmental student unions for any courses that you take.

Members of student unions organize social, academic, and career-related events for students and work together to better represent the needs and interests of students in their departments.



SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

Entrance funding opportunities

SFU offers entrance scholarships, awards and bursaries for incoming students.

- The Undergraduate Scholars Entrance Scholarship (USES) program recognizes students with strong academic records and meaningful community involvement. Scholarships range in value from \$20,000 to \$140,000.

DEADLINE TO APPLY IS DECEMBER 15, 2026

- Entrance Awards and Bursaries place greater emphasis on leadership, community engagement and financial need than on academic achievement alone.

DEADLINE TO APPLY IS MARCH 31, 2027

Financial supports

Undergraduate students can access a range of financial supports—including scholarships, awards and bursaries—that are available for both domestic and international students.

- Scholarships (\$1,000 to \$11,000) primarily recognize academic achievement
- Awards (\$1,000 to \$10,000) recognize accomplishments such as leadership, community involvement, volunteerism and other contributions
- Bursaries (\$500 and \$4,000) support students with demonstrated financial need
